## **Christmas 2017:**

- Gifts for all families working with Micah Projects' teams including Family Support and Advocacy Team, Brisbane Domestic Violence Service, Home for Good, Partners in Recovery, Street to Home and tenants of Brisbane Common Ground.
- 20 families, including 29 adults and 58 children, attended the Families' Christmas Party at the Yeronga Park Pool. Sincere thanks to Yeronga Park Pool for donating free entry; to GIVIT and Mt Gravatt Kindergarten who donated children's swimming togs and towels; and to Adopt a Backpack for donating children's gifts.
- 17 women and 30 children attended the Brisbane Domestic Violence Service Christmas Party. Gifts were generously donated by St John's Ambulance, RizeUp, Queensland Rail and Opal Raynbird Place.
- In addition, Lotus Place held a total of 9 Christmas events in Brisbane, Gold Coast, Gympie, Townsville, Mackay, Cairns, Burdekin, Bundaberg and Rockhampton attended by a total of 391 people. Gift vouchers were provided in lieu of hampers for 40 individuals and couples in regional areas.

## Hamper breakdown:

- 120 families received large food hampers
- 100 families received large fresh fruit hampers
- 205 individuals and couples received food hampers
- 105 individuals and couples received fresh fruit hampers
- Total of 530 hampers each large hamper had enough groceries to last a family one week
- In addition to this, 143 individuals at Brisbane Common Ground received a food hamper
- 215 volunteer drivers distributed gifts to the Brisbane metropolitan area and beyond, delivering as far away as Caboolture and the Gold Coast
- 310 volunteers participated on 21 and 22 December
- Total of \$18,295 was raised by the community to purchase hampers and provide emergency housing so that no child or family are on the street or in cars over Christmas.
